This week we were advised that our application for funding to replace the basketball backboards, rings and nets and the purchase of some 'shop' cubbies to make a 'shopping street' for imaginative play has been granted by the Buninyong Community Bank.

We value play opportunities that are inclusive of a variety of interests and hope that this will provide this diversity for the students in our school. We have students who love team sports and students who prefer imaginative play. Many thanks to the bank for providing us \$5,235 to cover the costs of adding these facilities to our playground area. This will add to our improvements to the sandpit area (Federal Grant in 2023), the new F/1 playground (Inclusive Schools Grant in 2024) and the new soccer goals funded by our PFA (2025).

Ready Settle Learn (RSL)

Many of you will be aware that some of our students participate in a smaller group program to start their day. This includes some quiet time to settle, some time to go through the schedule for the day and note any changes or special events and an opportunity for students to re-set themselves prior to entering the classroom. In addition to this program, we now offer *RSL small groups*. These are 20 to 30 minutes of a focus that meets different children at their point of need. These groups are flexible and depend on the need required. Some of the focus areas included are fine motor skills, social and emotional skills, Literacy and Numeracy. These may run for a few weeks up to a term and each student's needs will be monitored and the program continued or discontinued as required. If you have any questions about your child's involvement in these small group focus sessions please contact either myself, Kate O'Loughlin or Amy Fitzgerald.

Wellbeing and Rights, Resilience and Respectful Relationships

Monday 18th of August, 2025 - 3.35pm (in the OLA)

Respectful relationships education is part of the Victorian Curriculum and delivered by all Victorian government schools. Napoleons Primary School has been delivering the program for over 3 years now as part of our Wellbeing. It supports students to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed for respectful relationships, and helps to build respect and equality across the entire school community.

Research tells us that providing respectful relationships education at school can lead to positive impacts on students' academic outcomes, their mental health, classroom behaviour and relationships.

Our school uses the Department of Education's evidence-based teaching and learning resources to teach our students about Respectful Relationships from Foundation to Grade 6.


The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships resources have 8 topics; emotional literacy, personal and cultural strengths, resilience, problem-solving, stress-management, help-seeking, gender norms and stereotypes and positive gender relations.

We are fortunate to offer the opportunity to have Hannah Taylor (A/Liaison - Respectful Relationships from the Central Highlands Area) to provide an overview of the Respectful Relationships and answer any questions that you may have, with support from NPS staff.
