Melbourne Camp (Year 4/5/6)





In PE we have been doing a Ding test (fitness test – running and practicing different circuit activities) and will do it again in term 4 (Emily Jane)


I heard grade 4 were going to camp and doing talent shows and ice skating (Alayna)

It's the messiest, most fun way to help raise funds to feed those in need!








