Sleepout under the stars with Year 5/6 students

Year 5/6 students all gathered on our oval in tents last Friday night to participate in a range of activities around stars and constellations. Students also considered the Indigenous perspective and explored the 'Emu in the Sky' — (if you don't know about this, please ask a 5/6 student and they should be able to tell you). Students created some art work with glow-in-the-dark stars which we then displayed on the whiteboards of the classrooms where our Foundation/1 students were sleeping so they could also see some stars during their sleepover. We spent a little time exploring what an Aurora Australis was, especially given there were some Southern Lights visible only a week



Some students only stayed for a late night and others stayed the whole night in their tents and swags. I'm not sure how much actual sleep was had but some seemed to settle quickly and enjoyed a comfortable night's rest.

On Saturday morning, our students did a great job, as leaders, supporting F/1 students with getting their breakfast prior to heading home with parents between 8:30am and 9am. A special thank you to all those families who came along to help set up tents or swags on Friday night and collected their children promptly on Saturday morning. F/1 Sleepover



Congratulations to all our Foundation and Year 1 students for their sleepover at school. Children had a great time with their Kelly Sports activities, searching for the perfect marshmallow stick with their Year 5/6 buddies, enjoying their sausages, jelly and marshmallows and relaxing in their sleeping bags for their movie. Again some students stayed until after dinner and then went home, while other stayed the night. This is a great opportunity for students to have a supported stay overnight, especially when this might not be something children have done before. Thanks also to parents who encouraged their children to take the step of a sleepover without their parents or extended family and also a massive thank you to those parents who were on call if we needed to contact them through the night. Buddy work with kindergarten children







Each fortnight our 5/6 students participate in a combined session with the children from the Napoleons Kindergarten. We alternate between us visiting the children in their kinder or the kinder children coming over to our assembly area for an activity.



Yesterday our focus was on problem solving. Senior students worked in small groups that included one or two kinder children to create a bridge using straws, blocks, icy pole sticks or connector blocks, that spanned a board. The instructions included that it had to be up off the ground and it had to hold the weight of a toy dinosaur or toy car or a chess piece (we had an assortment of items). All the groups did an amazing job of creating and constructing their bridges. We then had a little chat as a whole group where some of the kinder children shared some of their nervousness about coming to school next year and some of our Year 6 students shared their feelings about leaving primary school and going to secondary school. Well done everyone.

Free Public Transport from 1st January 2026

From 1 January 2026, people aged under 18 can travel free on all Victorian public transport services using a new youth myki card. This includes trams, trains, buses and coach services.

To access free travel, they must tap the myki card on and off each time they travel. For areas that do not use myki cards, they must show their myki card to travel free.

Respectful, safe, engaged: shared expectations to support student behaviour

When schools, families and students work together, we achieve the best outcomes. These partnerships are essential to creating school environments that support all students to belong, learn and thrive.

At Napoleons Primary School all students are expected to be respectful, safe, and engaged. These behaviours help make our school a place where everyone can achieve their best. As a parent and carer, you play a vital role in helping your child to understand and meet shared behaviour expectations.

Students meet behaviour expectations by being:

Respectful

- · Following staff instructions and school rules.
- Caring for school property and others' belongings.
- Using respectful language.

Safe

- Keeping themselves and others safe from harm.
- · Speaking up or seeking help from an adult if they or someone else is being treated unfairly.
- Only bringing safe and necessary items to school.

Engaged

- Going to school every day, being on time, and ready to learn.
- Taking part, doing their best, and asking for help when they need.
- Knowing and following the school's policies, including the mobile phone policy.

Napoleons Primary School is supporting our students to meet these expectations by being:

Respectful

- Teaching and demonstrating school rules and positive behaviour expectations to students.
- Explicitly teaching, modelling and acknowledging expected respectful behaviour.
- Engaging collaboratively and positively with all students, parents and carers.

Safe

- Having clear policies and procedures to prevent and respond to bullying and keep students safe.
- Offering additional supports to students proactively and supporting students to speak up and seek help.
- Proactively identifying and addressing problems to maintain a physically, socially and culturally safe school environment.

Engaged

- Delivering evidence-based, inclusive education that meets the needs of all students.
- Empowering students to have a say in decisions that affect their learning and school life.
- Building strong, trusting relationships to ensure all students feel seen, heard and valued.

How parents and carers can help

By modelling and encouraging positive behaviour, you help your child build the skills and habits they need to be successful at school. This can include:

Respectful

- Knowing the school's rules and supporting them at home.
- Modelling respectful behaviour in how you speak to and about school staff, families, and others both in person and online.
- Making use of the school's processes to raise and resolve concerns early.

Safe

- Working together with staff if your child is having problems at school to understand and resolve the issue.
- Ensuring your child knows it is okay to ask for help from a trusted adult at school.
- Ensuring your child stays safe online by talking with them and addressing concerns early.

Engaged

- Helping your child to attend school every day every day counts.
- Communicating with school staff and working together to support your child's learning and wellbeing.
- Talking with your child about their day and how they are feeling and encouraging their learning by noticing their effort and progress.




