## *Ready to support your child with Before and After School Care*

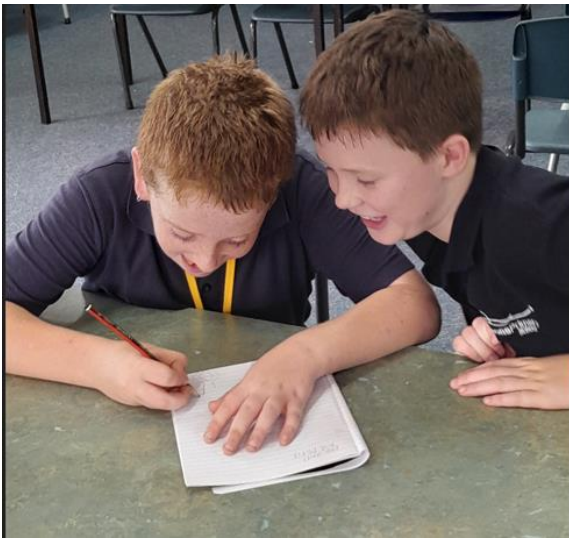
Please remember to book your children into before school care if you need to drop them off earlier than 8:45am.

## Breakfast Club

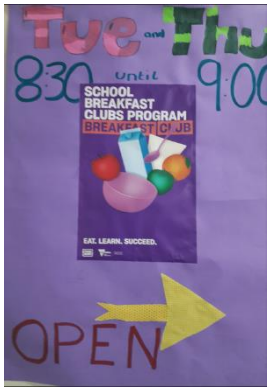
